


Roadtrippers

- I don't think you can share with other people




VisitACity

- Allows you to edit suggested itinerary, buy tickets, and add hotel.




Roadside America

- Lets you save interesting places




TravelStorys

- Auto-plays audio tour guide clips as you pass by markers on the road




Triplt

- One feature I really like is the stats where it says how many miles you've traveled




Mapstr

- Excerpt from App Store preview: Add your friends and share the places you want. Create tags to sort your places easily. See your friends places






- Must sign up. No planning tools.



BlaBla Car


App that helps you do carpooling and bus routes.

Pros:


- You could post a carpooling route
